There occured no changes after the communication of the rating to the rating object.

Rating summary:

Due to regulatory requirements, Creditreform Rating has withdrawn the outlook of the unsolicited ratings of the above-mentioned rating objects and replaced the outlook with "Watch UNW" (Watch uncertain). The reason is an adjustment made by Creditreform Rating to the methodology for corporate ratings Version 2.4 as of July 1, 2022. In addition to editorial changes, clarifications were made with regard to the industry analysis. Further details can be found in the press release (news) published on our website on May 25, 2022. The affected rating objects will be subject to a review within a period of up to six months.
